Friends for Therapeutic Equine Activities Scholarship Application

If the program participant is 18 years old or older and living independently, the participant must complete the form and supply the required financial information. If the program participant is under 18, or is 18 or older and requires a guardian, the parent/guardian must complete the form and supply the required financial information.

NOTE: SSDI or SSI recipients are not eligible for a scholarship award.

Application Procedure:

1. Print the Application Form on the next page.
2. Complete the form and attach copies of:
 - a. Your last 3 years' Federal income tax returns (IRS Form 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ) (or an explanation of why they are not available).
 - b. Your last 3 months pay stubs or unemployment receipts (or an explanation of why they are not available).
3. In providing Total Gross Income for prior years, use the amounts shown on Form 1040, line 22; Form 1040A, line 15; or Form 1040EZ, line 4.
4. Make a copy of the completed form for your records.
5. Mail the completed application and all attachments to:

Scholarship Selection and Awards:

1. All information will be held in the strictest confidence.
2. The Board of Directors Executive Committee of Friends for Therapeutic Equine Activities is solely responsible for awarding all scholarships.
3. An independent Scholarship Committee will make recommendations to the Executive Committee for scholarship awards, based on its anonymous review of all applications.
4. Scholarships are awarded for a single session, Spring, Summer, or Fall.
5. Participants may apply for consecutive sessions, but will be evaluated for each session separately. Prior awards do not constitute a basis for future awards.
6. Scholarships are not awarded in cash in any amount. They are awarded solely in the form of an offset to a portion of the fees charged for program participation and may not be used for any other purpose.
